HEALTH AND SAFETY!

Children: Parents should keep a ‘sharp eye’ on their children at all times, just as they would at a crowded sporting event, or in busy shops!

Travel to and from the Parade: Walk, cycle or use public transport if you can, but come anyway! ☺
